

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








Maps of the 2024 layout of the two tomato tents, showing where each variety will be located.

## Garden Education by Ila Falvey



#### **Cherokee Purple and Sungold Tomatoes**

I grew up in upper East Tennessee, just 10 minutes from the Virginia border and about a half hour from North Carolina. The Cherokee Purple tomato is a delicious heirloom tomato that is also from East Tennessee, rumored to have originated with the Cherokee people. The first time I grew one, it tasted like home. Cherokee Purples are big, meaty, savory-sweet slicers that turn a deep, dusky mauve with nearly black or dark brown tops when ripe. They probably produce better in the more moderate summer temperatures of the Appalachian Mountains than they do in Central Texas, but I always plant some, and perhaps the fact that they do not last very long in June's heat just makes the ones I harvest more special. They split easily, so do not over water them. Harvest them a little early so they can finish ripening indoors—the birds and bugs seem to think they are the best tomatoes in my plot, too, and will ignore the hybrids to peck and nibble at my beloved purple beauties as soon as they turn rosy. My spouse, who is not a gardener and does not know varietal names, simply calls the Cherokee Purples I bring home "the good ones."

Sungolds are my favorite cherry tomatoes. In many ways they are the opposite of Cherokee Purples: Sungolds are hybrids that are incredibly well-suited to our hot Austin summers and are very productive. They often keep setting fruit all the way until August. But like Cherokee Purples, Sungold tomatoes have a big, sweet-and-tangy taste. I have grown many different types of cherry tomatoes over the years, but none have been as dependably scrumptious as these little balls of pure summer sunshine.

Both of these tomatoes are very popular with Sunshine gardeners, with good reason. I enjoy trying out new types of tomatoes, but I always make room for these two.



#### **About Hoses**



maintains plumbing at the water stations, but the members must supply hoses. Be sure to keep hoses out of the paths to prevent tripping hazards. When hoses are not being used, they should be rolled in the plots or hung on the racks."

When purchasing new hoses and splitters, please, only buy hoses and splitters with brass fittings. If you use a hose or splitter with aluminum fittings it will fuse to our brass taps. Please read this article about brass and aluminum incompatibility. When attaching the hoses and splitters I recommend using a bit of teflon tape between all the threaded fittings for a leak-proof connection.

#### More grass than garden?

Please clean up your plot. If you have health issues that are keeping you from working on your plot contact your Zone Coordinator or the Vice President for assistance. Also, if you'd like to fallow your plot for the rest

of the summer, posted below is how to do that (taken from page 28 of the Handbook). Please make sure your Zone Coordinator or Vice President knows you are fallowing your plot.

#### Fallow Season or Cover Crop

Occasionally, members may choose to leave a plot fallow for a season. This is a good practice to provide the soil a break. Fallow plots should be cleared of plants and weeds, then covered completely with compost and then cardboard, a thick layer of leaves, or other material that allows water to permeate. Avoid using plastic as it creates a good environment for fire ants underneath, and water pools on top. An alternative to a fallow season is to plant a cover crop to serve as green manure; this can be turned under at the end of the season to condition the soil. Consult the literature or local garden center for details on this technique for soil improvement.
